

Certificate III in Aged Care (CHC30102)

Employment vacancies are available in nursing positions at all levels. This Nationally Accredited Certificate program provides an entry-level qualification to the Aged Care industry. Successful participants are qualified as Personal Care Workers with the employment competencies required for the Aged Care industry, a recognised growth area.
